Do you have to pay to charge an electric car?

You have to pay to charge your electric car at most charging stations. Owners typically charge electric vehicles at home, where energy costs less than "filling up" at commercial charging stations. Free charging stations are available at some shopping centers, providing slower Level 2 chargers to customers.

Where do most EV drivers charge their vehicles?

According to our Mobility Monitor report, 64% of EV drivers charge their vehicles regularly at home. Workplace charging comes in second, with 34% of drivers charging at work. 31% charge regularly at public and commercial parking spots, while 29% of them charge at gas stations.

How do I charge my eV at a public charging station?

To charge your electric vehicle (EV) at a public charging station, use an app like ChargeHub, PlugShare, or Chargemap to find nearby locations with available plug types. You may need a membership or to log in with your phone to recharge your EV at some charging stations.

Do you have to pay to charge an EV?

But remember that you don't always have to pay to charge an EV. Companies such as PlugShare provide maps of free charging stations all over the U.S., and some workplaces and businesses offer free EV charging stations. However, studies have shown that most EV owners recharge their vehicles at home.

Where can I charge my EV?

Many fuel retailers and service stations are starting to provide fast charging (also known as level 3 or DC charging). 29 percent of current EV drivers already charge their car there regularly.
