Aurora Energy does offer solar feed-in tariffs (FIT). They provide electricity plans with solar feed-in tariffs for households in Tasmania. While a great solar feed-in tariff is important, it's also crucial to consider usage rates and supply charges to find the best deal.

Who is eligible to buy solar products in Tasmania?

Solar products in Tasmania may only be available to solar customers. Some products may only be available to customers who purchase solar PV or other products through the retailer. For those Tasmanian households considering installing solar panels, there may be concerns about price, rebates and solar feed-in tariffs.

In Tasmania, you can expect to pay between \$4,800 and \$11,000 for residential solar panels up to 10kW, according to Solar Choice averages. As an estimation, smaller systems (3-4kW) will cost you around \$5,000, medium ...

In 2016 Aurora introduced two new time of use tariffs. Until then residential solar power systems were typically connected to tariff 31 meaning the electricity being produced from a solar system would not power the items on tariff 41 such as hot water cylinders, hard wired heaters and heat pumps.
