Tesla is finally opening up its Supercharger network to non-Tesla vehicles. It's now possible to charge a non-Tesla EV at a Tesla Supercharger.

How do I charge a non-Tesla?

First, download the Tesla app for your iOS or Android device and set up an account. You'll see a list of Tesla chargers near you, including what speed they use and whether they're open to the public. The first thing you'll probably see on the homescreen is "Charge Your Non-Tesla."

Where can I charge a non-Tesla Electric Vehicle?

Yes, you need the Tesla app to charge a non-Tesla EV at a Tesla Supercharger. The app is used for locating and paying for charging, as Supercharger stations don't accept other forms of payment.
