Can a non-Tesla electric vehicle charge at a Tesla Supercharger station?

Non-Tesla electric vehicles can charge at some Tesla Supercharger stations with the use of an adaptor such as the Magic Dock. You might think you need a Tesla to charge your electric vehicle at a Tesla station, but that is not the case.

How do I charge a non-Tesla?

First, download the Tesla app for your iOS or Android device and set up an account. You'll see a list of Tesla chargers near you, including what speed they use and whether they're open to the public. The first thing you'll probably see on the homescreen is "Charge Your Non-Tesla."

Can a Tesla charge a non-Tesla?

It may be useful to know that the Tesla charging network also has Destination chargers for slower charging (up to 22 kW) over a number of hours. These have Type 2 connectors so can be used by a wide range of non-Tesla electric cars such as the Vauxhall Corsa and MG4.

Where can I charge a non-Tesla Electric Vehicle?

Most useful for Electric Vehicle (EV) drivers and owners will likely be Tesla destination chargers, most commonly found at hotels, parks, and shopping centers. These chargers are primarily designed for Tesla vehicles and it's unlikely they will allow for non-Tesla charging unless Tesla goes around and updates those chargers.

What type of charging system does a Tesla use?

Each charging unit will use one of two cables: Type 2 (Tesla Model S and Model X) or CCS (Combined Charging System - Tesla Model 3 and Model Y, plus compatible non-Tesla electric cars). It's the largest EV charging network in the country, so having access to Tesla's Superchargers is a real bonus for electric car owners.

Do you need a Tesla app to charge a car?

Yes, you need the Tesla app to charge a non-Tesla EV at a Tesla Supercharger. The app is used for locating and paying for charging, as Supercharger stations don't accept other forms of payment.
