Can a non-Tesla electric vehicle charge at a Tesla Supercharger station?

Non-Tesla electric vehicles can charge at some Tesla Supercharger stations with the use of an adaptor such as the Magic Dock. You might think you need a Tesla to charge your electric vehicle at a Tesla station, but that is not the case.

Where can I charge a non-Tesla Electric Vehicle?

Most useful for Electric Vehicle (EV) drivers and owners will likely be Tesla destination chargers, most commonly found at hotels, parks, and shopping centers. These chargers are primarily designed for Tesla vehicles and it's unlikely they will allow for non-Tesla charging unless Tesla goes around and updates those chargers.

How do you charge a Tesla?

When you arrive at an open Supercharger station, park in a spot designated for non-Tesla vehicles. Once plugged in, open the Tesla app, select the Supercharger location, and start the session to begin charging. The app will handle the payment, and you can monitor your session's progress, just as a Tesla owner would.

Will Tesla add new supercharger equipment?

The White House confirmed that Tesla will add new Supercharger equipment to enable non-Tesla electric vehicles to charge at these stations. Tesla recently announced that Rivian vehicles will be able to charge on the Tesla Supercharger network.

How many Tesla Supercharger stations are there?

While most Tesla Superchargers will be available to non-Tesla drivers, about 5,000 older Supercharger stations will only be available for Tesla drivers. By the time of the migration in late 2024, over 12,000 Tesla Supercharger stations will be available for nearly all electric vehicles. Most non-Tesla vehicles use a CCS1 charging port.
