

Will Ford build an electric car battery plant in Michigan?

Ford Motor Co. recently announced plans to invest \$3.5 billion to build an electric car battery plant in Michigan with Chinese partner Contemporary Amperex Technology Limited (CATL)--the world's number 1 maker of electric-car batteries with 13 factories in Europe and Asia.

Where are CATL batteries made?

CATL was established in 1999 and has grown into a global leader in developing advanced battery technologies. It formed a partnership with BMW as early as 2012. The company has subsidiaries in Japan, France, Germany, Hungary, and the United States. It has 13 factories in Europe and Asia but none in the US.

Why did Ford build LFP batteries in Michigan?

Ford built a battery plant in Michigan to produce LFP batteries in order to obtain significant U.S. battery manufacturing subsidies from the Inflation Reduction Act. This could help Ford hit a goal of 8 percent profit margins on its EV operations by 2026, as the IRA ties a significant share of federal subsidies to domestic production and raw materials content.

How much money will Michigan spend on a battery plant?

Michigan has passed a combined incentive package worth as much as \$585 million to three local battery making projects, of which \$210 million will be allocated to finance the establishment of a \$3.5 billion battery plant by Ford and its manufacturing partner CATL.
