

How to use Dewa EV charging station?

o Each EV charging station has a QR code, which you need to scan to start using the charging station. o You can scan the QR code either through the camera on your smartphone (if your phone's camera has a QR code scanning feature) or download the DEWA Smart App available on Android and Apple devices.

How do I use the Dewa Green Charger card?

Once you have located the charging station nearest to you, you can use the Dewa Green Charger Card to charge your vehicle. Here is a step-by-step guide on how you can use it. o Scan your EV Green Charger Card and select the port you wish to use. (Each charging station has two ports) o Plug one end of the charging cable into the selected port.

What is Dewa Green Charger service?

This service enables customers that have DEWA EV account (s) as well as Guest Users (not registered in DEWA EV account service) to charge their electrical vehicles by scanning the QR code placed on DEWA Green Charger stations available across Dubai.

What does DEWA charge for?

DEWA charges residents for water, electricity, sewerage and housing fee (5% applicable only to tenants), with rent divided into twelve instalments every year. Bills vary depending on the types of accommodations, particularly if the house includes private swimming pools and gardens.

What types of charging stations are available for electric vehicles?

As an electric vehicle driver, you have the option to choose from four types of charging stations that have been provided by DEWA. The chargers are categorised according to their kW (kilowatt) capacity, which determines how long it would take to fully charge your vehicle and how much you may need to pay for it. o Wall Box Charger - 22 kW

How do I Register my car with Dewa?

o Click on the link provided in the email sent to you from Dewa, after you have registered your vehicle with the RTA. o Log in with your Dewa account if you already have one, or register as a first time user. o Go to 'EV Account & Charging Card Management' and register by filling in the form with details of your car and TC number.
