

Do you have to pay for Tesla charging stations?

Yes, new Tesla owners will have to pay to use a Tesla Charging Station. Although Supercharging involves a fee, it is usually cheaper than filling up a gas-powered car. If a vehicle remains connected to a Supercharger after being fully charged, there is a fine of up to \$1 per minute.

Where can I charge a non-Tesla Electric Vehicle?
