

How to make a container out of a solo cup

What can I do with Solo cups?

What type of plastic is a Solo Cup made of?

Solo cups are made of polystyrene, also known as PS or the recycling number 6. Polystyrene is used to make a variety of items, including toys, food containers, jewel cases, and Solo Cups. However, polystyrene is not widely recycled.

How can I recycle Solo cups?

To recycle Solo cups, you can sign up for TerraCycle's recycling program on their website and mail the cups to their headquarters through their nationwide program. Alternatively, you may be able to recycle Solo cups through a local recycling program.

What are solo cups & how do they work?
