

While a homeowner cannot be prevented from installing a solar energy system, certain restrictions may be imposed without violating the law. However, those restrictions must be reasonable, not arbitrary, and uniformly imposed on homeowners in a subdivision.

TAMPA, Fla. - For some homeowners, investing in rooftop solar panels can mean huge savings on monthly power bills, but a proposal in the Florida Legislature could dramatically cut back on reimbursement credits. Some lawmakers argue it's needed to offset costs to non-solar customers, but some worry it will destroy the home solar power industry.

Florida is not illegal to power your home with solar panels, but state laws and regulations dictate where and how you can acquire them. Most states have solar access laws that forbid any agreement, covenant, condition, bylaw, or contract that outlaws or limits solar installations by Homeowners Associations (HOA) or other municipal bodies.

This has meant that power purchase agreements (PPAs) are illegal in Florida. Starting in April of this year, the Florida Public Service Commission explicitly approved Sunrun's solar lease contract - stating it wasn't a sale of electricity, and that it ...

Put simply, solar panels are not illegal in Florida, but rules dictate where and how you can acquire them. Let's look at some of Florida's rules and regulations when it comes to using solar panels. The state has a law called the Florida Homeowners Solar Rights Act.

There is good news for solar enthusiasts in Florida. The state has ruled that no individual or entity, including homeowners' associations, can prevent the installation of solar panels at their property. However, certain design and appearance rules may apply, which are specific to each homeowner's association or district.

In Florida, you are legally mandated to connect any solar panels you have installed to the local grid, which means you are never truly free. To make matters worse, during a power outage, even if your system can sustain your entire home and family, you cannot rely on it. You must power down your system and generators.

Early in 2022, the Florida Legislature passed a bill that would have greatly reduced power bill credits earned by homeowners with solar panels, while allowing electric companies to charge them additional fees. However,
