

## What container is bigger then a solo cup for clones

On the pot sizes, I'd go from solo cup to 3 gal to your final 20 gal. I don't like the water daily method, keeps the roots too wet, easy to over water. I like to water it fully to some ...

Signs your cannabis plant is rootbound. Soil is drying out too quickly - When your container is drying out only a day or two after each watering it means your plant is drinking fast and may need more water than your current ...

I personally would veg those for 6 weeks at least, take clones, and flower the clones in whatever size container you want. I still would go for at least 1 gal pots, but if you ...

Many growers start their plants in a solo cup or a 1-gallon pot. ... When starting seedlings in a big container (bigger than 2-gallon), it's important to slowly give just a little bit of water at a time until your seedling "grows into" its ...

Nope. Don't transfer yet. Wait for some more vertical grow. Also imo don't transfer to 1 gal then 5 gal. Just go with the 5 gal. Water a diameter just bigger than a solo cup near stem area for a few days after transplanting.

I go from a solo cup to a 2 gallon pot to a 10 gallon grow bag. About a month in a solo cup and a month in a 2 gallon pot then they go into the 10gallon bag. Some plants go ...
