

# Who has the sole power of impeachment quizlet

What is the required majority for conviction in an impeachment trial?

The Senate shall have the sole Power to try all Impeachments ...[but]no person shall be convicted without the Concurrence of two-thirds of the Members present. The United States Constitution provides that the House of Representatives 'shall have the sole Power of Impeachment'.

What is the power of impeachment?

The U.S. House of Representatives holds the power of impeachment,which is the power to bring charges. The U.S. Senate has the sole power to try all impeachments. Conviction in the Senate requires a two-thirds vote. What actually happens when a president is impeached is removal from office.

Who has the power to impeach a president?

Under the Constitution,the House of Representatives has the power to impeach a government official,in effect serving as prosecutor. The Senatehas the sole power to conduct impeachment trials,essentially serving as jury and judge. Since 1789 the Senate has tried 20 federal officials,including three presidents. What branch is Congress?

Which branch of the US government has the sole power of impeachment?

The House of Representativesshall chuse their Speaker and other Officers; and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment. Vice President,and other federal officers--including judges--on account of treason,bribery,or other high crimes and misdemeanors.

Which Chamber of government has the power to impeach a government official?

House of representativeshave sole power to impeach and bring charges (51 majority). Senate have sole power to try (judge) impeachment cases. Which chamber of the federal government has the power to impeach a government official quizlet?

Who decides if a person is impeached?

In exercising the power of impeachment,the House determines whether to impeach,and if impeachment occurs,the Senate decides whether to convict the person and remove him from office.
